I re-write theorems, definitions, and proofs offered in class, because writing helps me process the topics.

Professor Alvarado would always encourage us to think creatively about how we might want to approach each problem and encouraged us to follow our gut instinct at first ti reason out how one approach could work but how another approach might be better. This self-directed learning was really beneficial in improving not only our understanding of analysis but also our skills in proof writing in general.

The most important things I learned from this course was to be a critical thinker and to embrace the complete confusion that was a part of the learning process of this material. A lot of the topics we discussed had detailed and delicate definions and theorems that were difficult to synthesize at first and often created a lot of confusion in the beginning. This class taught be how to embrace

this confusion and use it to direct my next steps that would allow me to better understand the material we were learning.
