Pace: very nice pace in the beginning of the semester. It definitely got a lot more faster and harder to manage towards the end. Part of it is due to the asynchronous format -- I found it hard to focus on the videos towards the end.

Presentation of information: The asynchronous format was challenging for me personally. I am a type of learner who does better with instant feedback and interactions. While the set up of the course with two discussion sessions per week helped a lot, I did not benefit as much as I wanted to because I would run out of time to go those (on top of watching all the lecture videos). I find that the amount of time I had to spend on class material to reach the same level of understanding was much longer in this asynchronous format.

Clarity of expectations: Extremely clear presentation of information and expectations. The professor is very good with communicating information and using different channels of communication including email and slack. The only point of improvement I would suggest is to have less changes to the syllabus during the semester. The change of class schedule/office hour/homework assignments makes it harder for students to plan their studies.

Assignments: The professor picked a very nice selection of homework questions and collaborative homework questions that were interesting to solve. One piece of feedback is to make sure the length of homework is more consistent. The professor is mostly very good at this except for the second to last homework piece. For that particular homework, while the number of questions was similar to other homeworks, each question involved many more subquestions that made that particular homework set take a much longer time to complete.

Activities/discussion: class content and delivery were impeccable. I really enjoyed the lectures and discussions. I think this professor has done a very good job in this aspect.

Like many, I would have by far preferred the in-person format to the virtual. Having said that, I also think that I would have preferred the synchronous Zoom lectures to the asynchronous videos. I found it completely impossible to be consistent with watching the videos (the first few weeks were manageable, but at one point I just fell off the wagon), which resulted in cramming the week leading up to the exams, and a relatively superficial understanding of the material. When I did stay on top of the schedule, it was extremely difficult to focus; the material is really dense. I honestly think that if the class had been synchronous online lectures that were recorded and shared afterwards, my semester would have been much, much better. Having to readjust my schedule to watch lectures at a time different from the "original" lecture time was extremely disorienting. Not going to class (by class I mean the sessions held at class time) made me feel guilty/bad, yet going to class felt awkward and not very useful when I was not up to date with the material. The system did not work for me.

I attended a few in-person sessions, which were helpful for completing the homework. I already knew the professor, so I felt comfortable intervening and asking questions. Professor Alvarado required us to create sheets at the end of each week listing out all of the theorems and definitions that we covered in class, which particularly helped me on homework assignments and exams. I kept up with lecture videos, and always attended in person sessions. I went to the Q Center once a week for homework help/exam prep/conceptual questions, the TAs on Monday and Tuesday nights, and occasionally went to Friday office hours. I found that only by reviewing the material daily was I able to keep up with the intensity of the course.

Professor Alvarado did an incredible job of breaking down complex topics into simpler, more manageable steps. In his lecture videos, he used a combination of visual, verbal, and symbolic perspectives to explain new concepts. I often found that every time I had a question, he would proceed to answer it in the video within the next 5 minutes! I think he made me a more confident proof writer by walking us through dozens of examples in lecture videos, which I was able to emulate on HW assignments and exams. I was nervous about keeping up with the pace of this

class, and while it was certainly very taxing, I developed a deeper appreciation for upper level math.

I think the skill that I developed the most in Analysis was how to write proofs that were logically correct and mathematically rigorous. I particularly appreciated learning how to approach proofs, and enjoyed seeing "proof sketches" in lecture videos that allowed me to fill in the rest myself.
